### Mohandas K Gandhi Born: Saturday, 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct 1869

Born into a family of divans, father a minister.

Mother very devout, modelled religious tolerance and acceptance. Seeds of the two streams he tried to unite – politics and a humanity of inclusion and tolerance present from the start.

In awe of authoritative father Parallel themes of grappling with outer authority and developing inner regard for practices of non-violence, sacrifice and respect for different religions.


Revered mother – met a monk, imbibed concepts of non-violence and sacrifice.






Answered the call of destiny at Lunar Node. Vowed allegiance to truth and morality.





### Birth to 21yrs



Born into a unique combination of politics and virtue from the outset.

Developed strong moral and ethical streak.

Personal life timeline accelerated – early marriage, death of parent, fatherhood. Death of his father essential for him to grow and be able to leave.

Timely Karmic Encounter opened path to destiny. Opposition brought forth a quiet determination and courage to follow his conviction.


Destiny took him from the life of a householder to unlikely adventures abroad.

ondon familiarized him with the British and prepared him for going up against them in the future.

- 22 Mother dies. Returns to India as a lawyer, wins first case but unable to set up a practice.
- 23 2<sup>nd</sup> son is born
- 24Takes up to work in South Africa. Faces intense racial24discrimination and injustice. Chooses to stay and fight for dignity.
  - Founds the Indian Natal Congress and begins to organize protests against bill that withholds Indians right to vote.

Birth of 4<sup>th</sup> child - feels procreation and family life incompatible with public service. 32 Meets his mentor in India. Forges important connection s in Bombay, Calcutta, Burma. 34 Takes over publishing of Indian opinion. Begins to write and share his political views


Completes familial obligations with birth family.

- 41 First attempt at communal living through Tolstoy Farm.

### 21 to 42yrs


Realizes he prefers to help people reconcile and find common ground versus fight.

21 day fast for communal harmony – fasting as a political tool. Brings the communities together.





Takes up cause of Independence. Steps onto the national stage.

Embraces his mission. Commits his life to service of his country and cause of unity and independence.






- 65 Demands British withdrawal.





Wife dies after 60yrs of marriage. Independence within sight but Jinnah wants separate country for Muslims.



Talks to keep India united fail. Bitterly disappointed when communal riots engulf the country.




Fire Trial – dream of united India burns to the ground with partition

- Fasts onto death for Muslims to get their due shot by a Hindu aggrieved by his bias.Shock of his death brings the communal violence to an end.

Earns the title of Father of the nation. Tries to bring all his children into the fold.

As one dream comes true, Fire trial reduces the other dream of a united India to ashes.

Fulfills his destiny and accomplishes his mission but not in the way he would have wanted.

Born into a traditional family in a small port town. Had a good balance of softness, freedom and boundaries. Had an idealistic, conscientious streak. Chose to expand horizons in England.

#### 21-42yrs SUMMER

Returns home to leave for SA again. Meets his destiny. Builds practice. Acquires experience, skills for Public Service. Gives up personal life over a growing sense of duty to the people.

#### 42-63yrs AUTUMN

Returns home, sheds old persona. No longer a lawyer. Puts skills and experience into service. Ripens his approach of peaceful non– cooperation. Pulls people together to join the fight.

#### 63 – 84yrs WINTER

Transforms into an Elder – called Father by nation. Leads by example. Fulfills mission and destiny. Even in death plays his role in accomplishing the cause - peace.
